



### Eligibility Chart

The following chart, prepared by David Yen of the Legal Assistance Foundation of Chicago, sets forth income guidelines for various programs which are based on the federal poverty guidelines, as revised by HHS on February 18, 2005. Please note, not all programs are automatically updated, so in some cases the increases are not effective until updated manual releases are issues or other formal action is taken (e.g., LAFMC guidelines do not increase until Board action is taken, and the food stamp guidelines will not change until later in the year). All guidelines are per month unless otherwise noted.
