ORDER CONDITIONALLY APPROVING CONSENT DECREE
AND APPROVING NOTICE TO THE PLAINTIFF CLASS

This cause coming to be heard on the agreed motion of the parties for this Court to conditionally approve the Consent Decree and to approve notice to plaintiff class members, and the Court being fully advised in the premises,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. The Consent Decree, attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference, is conditionally approved pursuant to Fed.R.Civ.P. 23(e), subject to any showing to this Court why it should not be finally approved.

2. The CHA defendants shall serve upon each class member the Notice of Proposed Settlement ("**Notice**"), attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by reference, within seven (7) days of the date of this Order, as follows:

(a) One copy of the Notice shall be mailed via first class mail by the CBA defendants to each Horner principal leaseholder residing at the Henry Horner development.

(b) One copy of the Notice shall be hand delivered by the CHA defendants to each Horner principal leaseholder residing at the

Henry Horner development either by personal service or by placing the Notice under the principal leaseholders' door. The CHA defendants shall be accompanied by a representative of plaintiffs during distribution pursuant to a schedule set by the CHA defendants.

(c) One copy of the Notice shall be posted by the CHA defendants in the lobby of each Horner building, in the social room at 1850 W. Monroe, Chicago, Illinois, in the Horner Local Advisory Council Office at 1936 W. Washington Street, Chicago, Illinois, and in the CHA Management Office at 1834 W. **Washington Street**, Chicago, Illinois.

(d) One copy of the Notice shall be mailed via first class mail by the CHA defendants to each applicant on CHA's active waiting list for public housing and to any applicant who has indicated a preference for residing in the Henry Horner development.

3. The Notice of Proposed Settlement shall advise class members to submit in writing any objections they may have to the Clerk of the Court no later than March 31, 1995.

4. This cause is set for hearing to consider any objections to the proposed consent decree and whether to finally approve the proposed consent decree on April 4, 1995 at 10:00 a.m.
